
Foothill Boulevard Rosemead Boulevard to Michillinda Avenue

City Council gave authorization to enter into agreement with County of Los Angeles (County) for Improvements of Foothill Boulevard from Rosemead Boulevard to Michillinda Avenue on November 4, 2013. If you would like to read the agenda report please click [Foothill Agenda Report](#). County is managing the project. The city boundary line is in the middle of the island on Foothill Blvd.

City of Pasadena (City) paid the County \$470,000 in estimated cost share for this project. This funding is from a one-time 2011 windstorm damage reimbursement from Federal Highway Administration. There is no additional funding for this project.

The scope of work is to improve roadway, existing median islands, and traffic signals, including curb ramp upgrades. The limit of work on Foothill Blvd. is from Rosemead Blvd. to Michillinda Ave. This limit allows only the median islands within this limit to be part of this project's scope of work. So the median islands from Rosemead to Michillinda will be improved with the

installation of river rocks which the City requested (per the request from Vice Mayor's Field Representative). The three (3) remaining median islands at Rosemead Boulevard and Foothill Boulevard (north, south, and west legs) will not be improved since they are not within the limit of work. Only the nose of these islands will be altered for traffic signal modification purposes.



Since City does not have additional funding to improve these remaining median islands, when there are future City projects, the remaining median islands can be improved at that time.

In 2009 and 2015, City submitted an MTA Call for Projects for the Improvement of Foothill Boulevard from Halstead Street to Rosemead Boulevard. Although, City was not successful in receiving funding for this project, Public Works staff is planning resubmit for the next MTA Call for Projects.
