

**Notice of Availability of Draft Environmental Impact Report
and Notice of Public Meeting for
Pasadena Non-Potable Water Project**

A Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) has been prepared by the City of Pasadena's Department of Water and Power (Pasadena Water and Power [PWP]) for the Pasadena Non-Potable Water Project. The Pasadena Non-Potable Water Project is located within the San Gabriel Valley, approximately 10 miles northeast of downtown Los Angeles in Los Angeles County, California. The Study Area includes portions of PWP's service area and areas outside of PWP's service area within unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County, La Cañada Flintridge, San Marino, and Glendale.

The Project would consist of a new non-potable water distribution system to meet local needs using local water sources. The Project would include water from three sources: 1) recycled water from Los Angeles-Glendale Water Reclamation Plant, 2) water from Devils Gate and Richardson tunnels, and 3) water from Arroyo Seco stream. It would supply 3,060 AFY non-potable water to customers within PWP, Lincoln Avenue Water Company, Foothill Municipal Water District, and California American Water Company service areas. Project components include pipelines, pump stations, storage tanks, and other facilities to deliver non-potable water. The Project pipelines would be located along the following major roadways and adjacent streets: Afton St. Laurel St., Linda Vista Ave, Rosemont Ave, Washington Ave., Grand Ave, California Blvd, Woodbury Rd, Calaveras St, N. Arroyo Blvd., and Mendocino Ln.

The Draft EIR analyzes the following potential impacts: aesthetics, agriculture and forestry resources, air quality, biological resources, cultural resources, geology and soils, greenhouse gas emissions, hazards and hazardous materials, hydrology and water quality, land use and planning, mineral resources, noise, population and housing, public services, recreation, transportation and traffic, utilities and service systems, environmental justice, and mandatory findings. All impacts were found to be less than significant or less than significant with mitigation measures incorporated. The Study Area contains a number of sites identified on the Cortese List (§65962.5 of the Government Code) of hazardous waste sites.
